# **Course Objectives**

By the end of this course, you will have a deep understanding of political systems, international relations theories, and economic principles. You will develop the analytical skills necessary to evaluate global issues, craft policy recommendations, and lead effectively in diverse environments. This course is ideal for students interested in pursuing careers in politics, diplomacy, international organisations, or leadership roles in any field.

### Module 1

# Foundations of Political Theory and Governance

Explore key concepts and ideologies in political theory, examining various forms of government, the role of institutions, and the influence of political ideologies on policy-making, with an analysis of different political systems through case studies and discussions.

### Module 2

# International Relations and Global Diplomacy

Study international relations with an emphasis on diplomacy and global conflict resolution, covering major theories, the role of international organisations, and global power dynamics, while analysing case studies of diplomatic negotiations and strategies for maintaining peace

### Module 3

# **Economics** and **Public Policy**

Investigate the intersection of economics and politics, focusing on how economic principles shape public policy, including topics like economic growth, fiscal policy, and international trade, with practical exercises in applying economic theories to address real-world issues.



# Previous projects include:

**Project 1:** "Designing a Sustainable Development Strategy for Emerging Economies" – A policy proposal aimed at promoting economic growth while addressing social and environmental challenges in developing countries.

**Project 2:** "Analysing the Impact of Global Trade Policies on National Economies" - A comparative study of trade agreements and their effects on economic stability and growth.



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# **Time to Shine**

For your Time to Shine project, you will undertake an extended research project that integrates politics, international relations, and economics. This project will culminate in a presentation where you will propose policy solutions or strategic initiatives.
