Topics may include social media's effects on youth behaviour, economic policies' impact on inequality, or culture's role in shaping identity, showcasing your ability to critically analyse and communicate findings effectively.

Previous projects include:

The Influence of Pop Culture on Social Movements

A project where a student examined how music, film, and social media have influenced contemporary social movements, using sociological theories and data to support their analysis.

This project offers you the opportunity to delve into a topic of interest, engage in critical thinking, and present your conclusions in a clear and compelling manner, demonstrating your proficiency in the social sciences.
